Reading and Listening

Tests understanding of:

- Familiar context (school, home, playground) Basic formulaic expressions
- · Basic vocabulary and phrases related to
- common objects and people
- Short and simple requests and directions Short and simple text about everyday

Reading and Listening Step 2

Intended for students who have developed some communicative skills

- Basic expressions, requests, phrases and directions

- Simple content-based texts



Speaking

intended for students in all stages of learning

- Tests understanding of:

 Ability to communicate orally in social situations related to daily life
- Expressing basic emotions and feelings
 Simple requests and giving directions
- Describing people, objects, animals, places and activities
 Explaining simple events




